**Date:** Date on which the assessment was undertaken.

### Programme Requirements

A Programme Specification is produced for each BPP University course leading to a University award. The Programme Specification is set out within the Programme Handbook, in addition to detailed information about individual modules taught upon the programme. Information about University academic regulations, policies and procedures is found in the BPP University General Academic Regulations and Manual of Policies and Procedures.

### Credit structure

Each individual module has a credit value. Each credit point relates to ten notional learning hours. Two credit points awarded by BPP University equate to one European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) credit point. There may be exceptions to the standard credit totals owing to entry at a later stage of the course, or Accreditation of Prior (Experiential) Learning (AP(E)L), or because of a change of course or the need to take a stage of the course for a second time.

### Grading scheme

Numeric marks are awarded on the scale 0-100. For modules at Levels 4, 5 and 6, mapped to the levels specified by the QAA National Framework for Higher Education Qualifications, the module pass mark is 40%. For the majority of modules at Level 7, the module pass mark is 50%. University policies and procedures with regards to assessment are set out in the University's General Academic Regulations, including the regulations with regard to reassessment, classification of awards, rounding of numeric marks and consideration of borderline assessments.
